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No rest for Storm's top players as Bird, Stewart, Loyd suit up

FIBA WORLD CUP

Americans in Spain, chasing a third consecutive title

Sue Bird headlines the 12 players picked to play for the USA Basketball Women's National team that's seeking its third consecutive FIBA World Cup championship. Bird, the first five-time USA World Cup team member, is joined by Storm teammates Breanna Stewart and Jewell Loyd.

Stewart helped Team USA to a gold medal at the 2014 FIBA World Cup, while Loyd is making her first appearance with the USA national team in an international

competition. Former Washington Huskies standout Kelsey Plum, a second-year guard with the Las Vegas Aces, also is making her debut at the FIBA World Cup with Team USA. Bird and Phoenix Mercury guard Diana Taurasi, both four-time Olympic gold medalists, are the most decorated members of the USA World Cup team that goes for its first threepeat.

Team USA also includes Tina Charles (New York Liberty), Layshia Clarendon (Connecticut Sun), Elena Delle Donne (Washington Mystics), Brittany Griner (Phoenix Mercury), Nneka Ogwumike (Los Angeles Sparks), Morgan Tuck (Connecticut Sun) and Alyssa Wilson (Las Vegas Aces). Held every four years, the

FIBA World Cup is the world's largest women's basketball international competition. The 16-team tournament begins Saturday in Tenerife, Spain. The quarterfinals are Sept. 28, the semifinals Sept. 29 and the finals Sept. 30.

Team USA opens play in preliminary round Group D against Senegal at 10 a.m. PT Saturday, followed by China at 10 a.m. Sunday and Latvia at 10 a.m. Tuesday.

Bird, Stewart and Loyd, who led the Storm to a WNBA title last week, joined the USA team in time for a scrimmage Wednesday against Australia.

Australia appears to be USA's biggest challenger for a third consecutive FIBA World Cup gold medal. Dallas Wings center Lisa Cummings, who led the WNBA in scoring with 23.0 points a game in 2018, leads an Australian team that also includes Storm guard Sami Whitcomb, Rebecca Allen (New York Liberty), Cayla George (Dallas Wings) and Stephanie Talbot (Phoenix Mercury) and is coached by Phoenix's Sandy Brundage.

Portland's Tsohonis feels at home in Seattle, gives UW verbal commitment

The Washington men's basketball team picked up its second 2019 verbal commitment when Marcus Tsohonis announced plans to play for the Huskies.

The 6-foot-4, 175-pound combo guard averaged 24 points, seven assists and seven rebounds last season as a junior at Jefferson High School in Portland.

Tsohonis, who is considered a three-star recruit according to 247Sports, took a visit to UW last weekend and picked the Huskies over Arizona State, USC, Washington State, Pacific, Portland, Montana and Fresno State.

Surprisingly, the top recruit in Oregon did not recruit active on offer from the local Pac-12 teams Oregon and Oregon State.

"I don't take it personally," Tsohonis told the Oregonian. "It's how they view me. I like how Washington believed in me and wanted me to come there. I have no hate against Oregon and Oregon State."

Tsohonis also plays for the AAU team Seattle Rotary and is teammates with UW's other 2019 commit, RanQuan Battle.

"The academics was definitely a big part of my decision," Tsohonis said. "When I play in Seattle, I just feel at home. Playing with those guys, I got the vibe that it was home. It's what I like. I played for Seattle Rotary, so I was around Seattle guys in the Seattle area. That felt like home."

Tsohonis averaged 12.2 points, 4.9 rebounds and 2.5 assists this summer for Rotary and was the fourth-highest scorer on the team behind Battle and UW recruiting targets Jaden McDaniels, a five-star 2019 prospect, and Paolo Banchero, a top 2021 prospect.

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Mavericks owner Cuban to donate \$10 million in settlement after probe

DALLAS — Dallas Mavericks owner Mark Cuban has agreed to contribute \$10 million to help further the cause of women in sports and raise awareness about domestic violence after an investigation released Wednesday substantiated numerous incidents of sexual harassment and improper workplace conduct within the franchise going back more than 20 years.

Investigators hired by the outspoken billionaire said there was no evidence to show Cuban knew of the most explosive allegations involving former team president Terezina Usery. But the report faulted Cuban for not firing two employees when there were clear signs he should have.

The report was made public some seven months after Sports Illustrated detailed years of examples of a hostile workplace for women on the business side of the team.

because he was rarely in the club's business office. It is housed away from the home arena and basketball operations. But when some issues were brought to Cuban's attention, he erred by not acting swiftly, the report said.

In one case, a successful ticket salesman wasn't fired after surveillance video showed a used condom slipping out of his pants. Years earlier, Cuban had been told pornography was found on the employee's computer, and Cuban warned him that he would be fired if it happened again.

When told about the condom, Cuban was not aware of any further issues with pornography on the computer and wrote to Usery, "Don't make a bigger issue out of it than it is." The employee wasn't fired until three years later after other issues came up, including with a new female employee.

In another case, Cuban didn't fire team website reporter Earl Sneed after learning of a second domestic-violence allegation against him. The accuser was another employee. Sneed was fired after the SI report,
